## Make your own little friend

## A world of possibilities

Make a doll or a teddy using simple patterns then dress it up.

- 1. Decide which materials and methods to employ
  - 1. Knit
  - 2. Crochet
  - 3. Sewing
  - 4. Needle-felting
  - 5. Materials: natural or man-made, repurposed or new
- 2. Plan out a design on paper
- 3. Start building pieces
- 4. Assemble the toy
- 5. Consider accessories and clothing for the toy
- 6. Secure loose parts for safety taking into consideration the age of the recipient

One on one sessions are \$30 each.

The Red Cross estimates that each Trauma Teddy takes 5 hours to complete. The time to complete a toy will depend on the student's independence, whether they can continue working on it outside of class time, how elaborate they would like the project to be. For a simple toy to be completed in class time, 5 lessons sounds like a good estimate.
