1. Four effects of formal sin are Guilt, a debt of punishment, evil inclina3 tions, bad habits 2. Guilt is abolished by an act of perfect contrition, the sacrament of penance and martyrdom. 3. It is abolished (wholly). 4. The forgiving of sin (does not) necessarily abolish also all temporal punishment due to sin. 5. The guilt of venial sin and all evil inclinations and habits due to sin are abolished at death by the fervour of the soul's charity. 6. Any punishment due to sin, however, remains, 7. This (can) keep a soul from entering heaven immediately. 8. Purgatory is a *place* and a *state* in which the souls of persons who have died in grace suffer on account of the temporal punishment due to sins committed after baptism, before they can be admitted into heaven. 9.
